

The Weston Forest Disc Golf Course project is headed by, Joshua Quackenbush & members of the Middleboro-Lakeville Disc Golf Club. By installing a disc golf course in Weston Forest we (the members of the club & the town of Middleborough) will provide FREE lifetime recreational use and enjoyment for the town's residents as well as visitors to our town. This course is not just for the experienced, but for new players young and old. By installing a disc golf course at the Weston Forest location we are providing yet another reason to visit one of Middleborough's hidden gems.

The total cost for a 21 hole course at this location (using fiscally responsible materials) is approximately \$13,000. This covers cost of baskets (the target for the discs), stone dust, lumber (4x4x8 for the Tee Box), Rubber pads (4x6x3/4" for the tee - footing), signs, & cement. This does NOT include the price of labor (total volunteer hours ~ 10 people 2 days/ hole = 2100 total work hours -for 10 people- @ minimum wage = \$19,000, tools, volunteer landscaper hours, and rental tool use.) The volunteer work is worth more than half of the cost of the installation and materials of the course itself.

The actual timeline of the course installation should be slightly less than 3 months from start of project. IF the course construction started July 1st, with all materials on hand, it could be completed by October 1st... maybe even sooner.

Step 1: Clear fairways of brush and debris. Clean out parking lot. Place markers for hole locations.
[6-10 weeks]

Step 2: Install baskets. (the course is PLAYABLE)
[3-5 days]

Step 3: Install tees and pads. (the course is almost complete. This will mark the unofficial opening and we will invite all those who have helped to make this course a reality to see and play the course as it was meant to be before it's unveiling.)
[3-5 days]

Step 4: Install signs. (Grand opening!)
[1-3 days]

Step 5: clear out rough (this can and will happen as the holes get cleared, but further clearing will happen as the course gets played)
[continuous]

Financial sustainability will come from the Disc Golf club and league nights and meets.

Membership dues are low and weekly outings will bring in a small income for use on the course itself as well as the land it is cohabitating.

The Weston Forest Committee and the town Parks Department have given this project their full support.
